

## Studio Connie Cute Cowl and Matching Headband

### Headband Pattern

You will need:

1 100g ball Serenity Super Chunky  
US 15 (10mm) knitting needles

#### Pattern

CO 7

Row 1: Knit

Row 2: K1, K2T, YO, K1, K2T, YO, K1

Repeat these two rows until you reach the desired length of your headband. I found it easier to just wrap the knitting round my head to gauge the right length (this also allows you to see how much the wool will stretch).

Cast off and leave enough wool to sew the headband together.

The headband is actually really pretty without any embellishment but I wanted a bit of sparkle so added a flower with sequins. I found the pattern for the flower online but have had it for so long I've forgotten where! But at least I'm not claiming it as my own ;-)

### Flower

You will need:

1 100g ball Serenity Super Chunky  
US 10 (6mm) knitting needles

#### Pattern

CO 40 sts

Row 1:

K1, BO 6 (you should have 2 sts on your right needle)

K1, BO 6 (you should have 4 sts on your right needle)

K1, BO 6 (you should have 6 sts on your right needle)

K1, BO 6 (you should have 8 sts on your right needle)

K1, BO 6 (you should have 10 sts on your right needle)

Cut your yarn 8" long. Thread the 8" tail through a tapestry needle and pull that needle through each of the remaining 10 stitches on your needle. Secure tail and shape flower. Sew in ends.

Add any extra finishes like sequins and sew onto the headband.

### Cowl Pattern

You will need:

2 100g balls of Serenity Super Chunky  
US 10.5 (6.5mm) circular needles

#### Pattern

CO 100 stitches.

Cast on more stitches if you want it to be a longer cowl or fewer stitches if you want it to sit tighter around your neck.

Knit continuously until the width is about 10" or as wide as you want!
